FREQUENT QUESTIONS

What is the time commitment?

We ask that members of the Leaders Council attend two full board meetings per year, one of which is in-person. In addition, members will be assigned a committee that meets several times a year (typically 4-6), mostly often via phone or virtual meeting.

When are meetings held?

Full board meetings take place in the fall and spring, with the fall meeting in-person and the spring meeting online. Committee meetings are scheduled at the discretion of the committee chair and are intended to work with the committee members' schedules.

What are the current committees?

Current standing committees include Membership; Diversity, Equity and Inclusion; Fundraising; Community Engagement; and Events.

How long is a term on the Leaders Council?

The initial term is four years beginning on July 1 and may be extended for an additional four-year term.

Do I have to live in North Carolina?

No. We welcome candidates from across the United States and beyond and are actively recruiting for members outside of North Carolina.

Do I have to be an alumnus?

No. While the Leaders Council is largely comprised of College of Design alumni, we welcome interest from design professionals and industry partners who are dedicated to the mission of the College of Design and can demonstrate involvement, commitment, and support to the college over a four-year term.

What is the financial commitment?

We encourage members to contribute to the College of Design in a way that is meaningful for them. This philanthropic amount may be different from everyone, but we ask for 100% participation from our board.

Do I have to ask people for money?

There are ways for everyone to be involved in fundraising for the College of Design, from making introductions to your network to hosting events and thanking donors. In addition, we have a fundraising committee that reaches out to strategically raise money for the college with the help of the college's development team.



STANDING COMMITTEES

Leaders Council members are asked to join one of several standing committees and serve on a committee throughhout their term. When you complete your application, you will be asked to include your top committee nominations. Committee assignments are based on the overall committee's needs and best fit.

Community Engagement Committee

The purpose of the Community Engagement Committee is to provide guidance on the development, implementation, and assessment of initiatives related to community-College partnerships and collaborations. This committee helps the Leaders Council and College broaden efforts to serve the public and increase impact through mutually beneficial partnerships in the community and beyond.

Diversity, Equity and Inclusion Committee

The purpose of the Diversity, Equity & Inclusion Committee is to ensure continuing board, college and institutional progress toward the intentions of College of Design's strategic plan goals concerning diversity, equity and inclusion (DEI). The committee will ensure that Leaders Council members are familiar with and able to represent to community stakeholders the ongoing DEI-related efforts underway at the college.

Events Committee

The purpose of the Events Committee is to comprehensively review all events and ensure their compatibility with the mission and goals of the college; to participate in the planning and implementation of selected events; and to continue to evaluate the success and impact of events and suggest changes.

Fundraising Committee

The purpose of the Fundraising Committee is to assist the College of Design with meeting annual and campaign fundraising goals. Members will partner with the College's Office of Development and External Relations to create a culture of giving and actively participate in fundraising activities.

Membership Committee

The purpose of the Membership Committee is to develop future Leaders Council members and to put forth bylaws and any future modifications to the Executive Committee for its approval.
